Miracle Market was established in 1961 by George White who left Louisiana for Los Angeles at the age of sixteen. George White's southern roots influenced the products sold at Miracle Market including sweet cane syrup, black-eyed peas, and Louisiana hot links flavored with various spices. The delicious hot links, especially the ones made from chicken sausage, became a popular staple for Compton residents; they are still a top item enjoyed by customers today!

Miracle Market inspired other market owners in surrounding neighborhoods to create similar products. Similarly, the market influenced the food culture of barbecue and soul food important to Black history and community in L.A. When people with backgrounds from Mexico and Central America moved to Compton, new items were introduced to support community needs. Miracle Market is an example of a legacy business that brought, and continues to bring, people together through delicious foods! Draw a legacy business that you have visited or would like to visit! 
What's a Legacy Business?
